 - Providing a place for leaders to thoughtfully and constructively engage in praying, planning and working together to further the kingdom of God by pursuing the issues in the CTC

- **Communicating: *providing timely, relevant information***
 - Lausanne Global Analysis
 - Lausanne Regional Communications Managers
 - Websites including Lausanne.org and Lausanne.org/conversation
 - Publications (from Cape Town 2010 and future consultations)
- **Catalyzing: *moving from talk to action***
 - Leadership reorganization
 - Cape Town Commitment curriculum
 - Younger Leaders meetings
 - "Davos-like" meetings of global evangelical leaders

Lausanne Movement International Deputy Director Regions



At the 2004 Forum for World Evangelization, Lausanne regionalized the work of the Movement by appointing International Deputy Directors (IDDs). **International Director, Lindsay Brown**, gives leadership to the IDD's who have responsibility for their regions and seek to bring leadership, vision, networking and general oversight with regard to world evangelization. The IDD's are volunteers and have a primary ministry alongside of Lausanne responsibilities:

Caribbean – Las Newman (29 Countries), President of Caribbean Graduate School of Theology in Kingston, Jamaica.

EPSA – Nana Yaw Offei Awuku (27 English, Portuguese and Spanish speaking Countries in Africa), Senior Management Team member with Scripture Union in Ghana.

Eurasia – Anatole Glukhovski (12 Countries), President of Ukrainian Evangelical Theological Seminary in Kiev, Ukraine.

Europe – Currently Vacant (44 Countries)

Francophone Africa – Emmanuel Ndikumana (24 Countries), Training Secretary for Partners Trust International.

Latin America – Marcos Amado (20 Countries), Missions Pastor at Morumbi Baptist Church and starting a Missiological Centre in São Paulo, Brazil.

MENA – Andrea Zaki (18 Countries in the Middle East and North Africa), respected senior leader in the region.

North America – Tom Lin (Canada and USA), Vice President of Missions at InterVarsity and Director of the Urbana Student Missions Conference.

North East Asia – David Ro (6 Countries), involved with urban church planting and leadership training in East Asia.

South Asia – Ivan Satyavrata (9 Countries), Senior Pastor and Chairman of the AG Church and Mission in Kolkata, India.

South East Asia – Philip Chang (10 Countries), Chairman of Interserve Malaysia.

South Pacific – Daniel Willis (29 Countries), involved in pastoral ministry for the past 27 years.
