Welcome!

Welcome! We are gathered here in beautiful Georgetown, Guyana to participate in the Lausanne Caribbean Leaders Gathering! I'm glad we are here together, whether in-person or participating remotely online. This is an important moment.

What do you say to a Christian community scattered across a wide region, who are under pressure either from strong hostile external forces or from internal mission malaise or loss of vision? What words do you use to encourage and exhort? For answers, we will turn in Scripture to the letter of the Apostle Peter to the first century AD churches, scattered throughout the Roman Empire, under severe and hostile pressure. In their circumstances, Peter urged, "prepare your minds for action, keep sober in spirit, set your hope completely on the grace to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ." [1 Peter 1:13 NASB]. What do we say to the church in the Caribbean today?

The church in the world is under pressure. The church in the Caribbean today is under threat. Are we at ease in Zion? All around, the Caribbean church has been on a path of decline. It is declining numerically, spiritually, and in missional impact. Caribbean society is under severe threat from natural disasters, climate change, global pandemics, and a morally vacuous global culture. How do we prepare our minds and our people for action? How should we respond?





We gather under the theme, “Redefining 'MISSION' for the Caribbean Church in the 21st century: God on the Move!”, to discuss five (5) topics selected for particular program focus in Guyana:

- ‘The Caribbean Church: Making Disciples or Discipling the Nations?’
- ‘The Gospel in the workplace and in the diaspora’
- ‘Caribbean youth and Church Engagement’
- ‘The Mental Health Challenge, Spiritual Healing, & the Church’
- ‘Climate Change, the Caribbean Environment, and the Gospel’

The Caribbean is rapidly changing. Contemporary mass migrations and movements of peoples across continents have created significant diaspora communities with diaspora churches, including the Caribbean diaspora in Europe, North America, and elsewhere. This has brought into full light new questions about missions and new theologies of mission. People are on the move! God is on the move!

In 2015, the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) hosted a “Forum on The Future of the Caribbean”, under the rubric “Disruptive Thinking, Bold Action. Practical Outcomes”. She has also provided consultant services for the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) - UNODC Youth Gangs and Violence: Partnering for Social Development Project, and was engaged by Child Evangelism, Guyana, as Team Leader for Project Hope Agricola – an initiative aimed at restoring social capital in Agricola following gang take-over of the neighbourhood.

Other notable areas of work include trainer/facilitator for programmes to address suicide, substance use and addiction, racial harmony, and life skills. She is currently serving as the National Director of Inter School/ Inter Varsity Christian Fellowship.

Driven by her love for Christ and a passion for empowering young people, Flemlyn has, over the past 24 years, dedicated her knowledge, skills, expertise, and gifts, to disciple youth and young adults. Edward Anthony (“Tony”) Allen, a Jamaican and now retired, has a medical degree from the University of the West Indies, Mona, along with graduate training in Psychiatry at the Royal Edinburgh Hospital, UK and a Masters in Divinity from Yale University.

He has pursued an integrated career as a psychiatrist and as a consultant in Church-based Wholistic Health Ministries and has sought to integrate a whole person perspective to client care. He has worked as a psychiatrist at the University Hospital of the West Indies and lecturer at the University of the West Indies, Mona as well as in private practice.

Dr. Allen has developed a flagship model of a Healing Ministry at the Bethel Baptist Church. He served on the Christian Medical Commission of the World Council of Churches and carried out assignments for World Vision International.

He is a Global Collaborator for Health For All Nations.

Through talks and workshops, Dr. Allen has worked with medical colleagues, churches and the public to help them empower self and others through a whole person approach to overcoming and wellness.

ABSTRACT

MENTAL HEALTH IN THE CARIBBEAN AND THE ROLE OF THE CHURCH

E. Anthony Allen

Globally, mental health disorders are a leading cause of ill health and disability. The Caribbean is equally affected and needs to scale up its policies and interventions to avoid a looming social and economic crisis, especially post-COVID-19 pandemic. Mental health literacy is an urgent need, so also is the need for the Church in the Caribbean to clarify its role and its theology.

This presentation provides an understanding of what constitutes mental health and mental illness, and what are the mental health challenges to be overcome. Common risk factors for mental illness arising from our historic legacy and geography are described as well as treatment gaps in regional services.

The church's role in relieving mental illness is bound up with its evangelical witness of salvation for all. Hence the need to review its mindset and to incorporate mental health as part of a wider ministry of healing which focuses on the wellness aspect of mental health as well as a congregation-based community approach which is the most effective way of helping.

A model for Best Practices for being the Church as a Healing Community is described as well as a case illustration of the experience of the Bethel Baptist Church in Jamaica.

**Rev. Dr. Dave
Bookless**

Dave Bookless is Director of Theology for A Rocha International (www.arocha.org), an international Christian nature conservation organisation established for 40 years and now working in over 30 countries across 6 continents. As part of his role, Dave serves as a Global Catalyst for Creation Care with the Lausanne Movement co-leading the Lausanne/World Evangelical Alliance Creation Care Network (LWCCN). LWCCN has pioneered a global campaign on 'Creation Care and the Gospel', launched in 2012 in Jamaica and leading to 12 further regional conferences. This has sparked a global movement and the LWCCN newsletter, The Pollinator, goes to over 1700 people in 100+ countries.

Dave's passion is communicating and living out the whole Gospel: the Bible's big story of God's good news from creation to new creation, centered on Jesus. He is a theologian, with a PhD from Cambridge University examining biblical perspectives on wildlife conservation, and lectures regularly in universities and seminaries, as well as speaking to conferences and churches all over the world. He is an author, having contributed to over 20 books, including writing Planetwise (translated into Chinese, Dutch, French, German, Korean and Spanish) and God Doesn't Do Waste. He is also an ordained Anglican minister assisting at a multiracial church in Southall, London, and a member of the Church of England's Environment Working Group. In addition, Dave serves on global committees for the Season of Creation and Renew our World. Born in India to missionary parents, Dave along with his wife Anne has lived in multifaith Southall since 1991 and brought up their four daughters there. To relax, Dave enjoys birding, running, mountain walking, and Indian food.





ABSTRACT

CREATION CARE & THE GOSPEL

Rev. Dr. Dave Bookless

When we think about the Gospel we often start with The Great Commission, Matthew 28:19-20, when Jesus tells his followers to go into the world to make disciples of all nations. From that we easily make assumptions that the Gospel is about saving and discipling individual people. Yet, when Jesus talked about the Good News – the Gospel – he always spoke about ‘the Kingdom of God’. The Kingdom of God concerns letting God be in charge of every area of existence. Of course, that begins with our relationship with God, but it goes much further and covers all our relationships – with our neighbours, with our enemies, with money, work, and with all of creation. In fact, one theologian has summarised the Kingdom of God in its widest sense as ‘creation healed’. The prophetic vision of ‘shalom’, restored harmonious relationships with God, each other, and with the natural world, is fulfilled in Jesus’ teaching about the Kingdom of God.

To grasp how big the Gospel – the good news of Jesus - really is, we need to look at God’s purposes from creation to new creation. In this talk, we’ll rapidly go through the Bible seeing five major ways that God intervenes in the story, and how each of these concerns not only people but all creation:

- Creation – God makes it all ‘very good’.
- Covenant – God’s plans to offer hope in a fallen world.
- Christ – God entering into creation in order to redeem it.
- Church – God pouring out the Holy Spirit to create Christ’s body here on earth.
- Completion – when Christ will return to make all things new.

The talk will conclude by looking at how we can integrate biblical creation care into our ministry, mission, worship, discipleship and lifestyles.

Dr. Sam George

Sam George is of Asian Indian origin and has lived, studied, and worked in five countries. He currently makes a home with his family in the northern suburbs of Chicago and directs Global Diaspora Institute at Wheaton College, besides serving as a Catalyst of the Lausanne Movement. Sam holds degrees in Mechanical Engineering and Business Management and worked in the technology industry for a decade before studying at three seminaries, earning a Ph.D. from the United Kingdom. He travels widely to research and teach at churches, conferences, seminaries, and universities around the world. He has authored/edited a dozen books, including a recent three-volume on Asian Diaspora Christianity.





ABSTRACT

PEOPLE ON THE MOVE AND GOD ON THE MOVE

Sam George

Human migration has become a defining issue of our times worldwide. While it is as ancient as humanity itself, yet the volume, scale, direction, and urge to migrate over longer distances in recent decades are truly unprecedented. This phenomenon is transforming every facet of life everywhere and is fundamentally altering societies, cultures, economies, nations, and the entire world order. Human movements are extremely important to Christianity, especially in its emergence as the most global, dispersed, and diverse religion on the planet.

Nearly all Biblical writings are diasporic, meaning they were written by, to, for, and about migrants and their descendants. It was composed, distributed, interpreted, translated, and is being read in the context of some form of displacement. Its authors, original readers and carriers were migrants or their progenies who lived as minorities in foreign lands. One may claim that diaspora is a metanarrative of the Bible. Christianity is a diasporic faith, and the diaspora factor makes it an exceptional translatable and transportable faith. Just as Jewish diaspora of the first century determined the trajectory of its expansion, today's diasporas are at the forefront of its growth and transformation.

This lecture will present the current state of global migration covering various People on the Move (migrants, refugees, students, expats, transnational, etc) and its implications for global missions today, including diasporas from (going where) and to (who is coming) the Caribbeans. It will feature a fresh reimagination of Christian doctrines with a new theological framework – Motus Dei (God on the Move) for a Global Christian Witness for a World in Motion in the 21st century.

**Dr. C. B. Peter
Morgan**

Dr C B Peter Morgan is a Founding Director and immediate past President of the International Third World Leaders Association (ITWLA) with headquarters in Nassau, Bahamas. He is the current Chairman of the Presbytery of the newly inaugurated International Association of Kingdom Churches and Ministries (IAKCM), a global network of Christian Leaders and Ministers. He is also a founding Director of the newly established Caribbean Israel Leaders Coalition (CILIC), and the Senior Advisor to the Caribbean Transformation International Network established to work with Senior Church leaders in the Region. He is the Co-Chairman of the Board of Directors of WOLIM-ICC an organization with consultative status to the United nations

Dr Morgan has developed a Global Philosophy built on the providential foundation of the Fatherhood of God. He has produced many papers and articles on the dynamic theme of Nationhood. They cover such topics as: 'The Leadership of the Church within the Global Environment'; "Community Transformation and the Quiet Revolution"; "Global Political Tension between the Nation-People and the Nation-State"; "Career Development and Schools Counseling"; "Marriage, Parenting and Family Life"; "The Journey Inward—a Therapeutic Devotional Exercise". His most recent work is the "Making a Mentor Program" in which he trains leaders of one generation to preserve their legacy through Mentees.

Dr. Morgan is the author of "The Nations: God's Strategic Purpose for Establishing your Nation"; "The City Church – A Personal Pilgrimage"; and "Letter to the Church in the post-Covid-19 Era". The major thrust of his publications addresses the need for the Church to become more actively involved in the leadership of the communities and cities in which they are functioning.

His work has taken him across Latin America and the Caribbean, the United Kingdom, Holland, South Africa, Zimbabwe, Canada, and the U.S.A. In these settings he provides consultation to Leaders in Churches, Academia and Civil Governments. He is acknowledged as one of the leaders of the Church renewal movement from the 1970's which has impacted both Protestant and Catholic Churches across the Caribbean.

He is married to Trinidadian, C Patricia nee Achong, who ministers along with him. Together they have one daughter and three sons, all of whom are in full-time Ministry. They are the proud grandparents of five children.

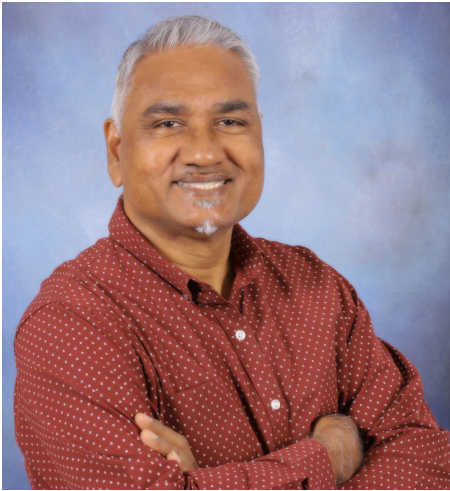

SUICIDE PREVENTION AND MENTAL HEALTH IN THE CARIBBEAN

This session gives participants an overview of the occurrence of some common mental health challenges and the incidence of suicide in the Caribbean. It is aimed at helping participants to better understand the issue of suicide, its causes, warning signs and associated myths. Participants will be empowered to recognize vulnerability to suicide, the process of becoming suicidal and will be exposed to useful prevention and intervention strategies, aimed at helping people choose life. INSPIRED Toolkit for better mental health will be highlighted.

MENTAL HEALTH, SPIRITUAL HEALING, AND THE CHURCH

Mental Health problems is the leading cause of ill health around the world and the Body of Christ is not exempt. The Lord Jesus, however, healed a lunatic at the start of his ministry (Matt 4:24). God's servants must therefore be equipped to effectively minister to not just the spiritual needs of people but their mental health challenges. While facilitating psychoeducational workshops, I offer a cognitive behavioural therapeutic approach to intervention that is not just clinically excellent but biblically based.

Purpose of the Regional Gathering

One of the main purposes of this regional gathering is to delve deeper into the issues raised during the Caribbean 'Listening Call' held in September 2022. Five Primary Themes:

2. Spiritual Healing and the Mental Health Challenge



3. Caribbean Youth and the Church



4. The Environment/Creation Care and the Gospel



5. The Caribbean Church and the Disciple-Making Challenge



GUIDELINES FOR THE DISCUSSION GROUPS

Discussion Sessions:

During the gathering, participants are invited to contribute to the five themes through small group discussions. The discussion will be framed by the following five questions:



What are the most significant gaps or remaining opportunities towards the fulfilment of the Great Commission?



What promising breakthroughs and innovations do you see that can accelerate the fulfilment of the Great Commission?



In what areas is greater collaboration most critical in order to see the fulfilment of the Great Commission?



Where is further research needed?



To whom else should we be listening as part of this process?

Approach and Perspective:

Participants are encouraged to approach the discussions as "consultants" and provide a collective but diverse Caribbean perspective on the issues at hand. The goal is to contribute to the development of future strategies and initiatives that can be undertaken as a region to advance the Kingdom of God.

These guidelines will serve as the framework for the research and discussions during the regional gathering. The insights and findings obtained will be used to inform future actions and initiatives to further the Kingdom of God in the Caribbean.

SEOUL 2024: AN OPPORTUNITY TO LISTEN, GATHER AND ACT – TOGETHER

The objective of Lausanne 4 (L4) is to catalyse the collaboration of the global church towards the discipling of the nations and the shaping of the world in 2050. Key to L4 are the rhythms of listening, gathering, and action.

An integral part of Lausanne 4 is the Fourth Lausanne Congress on World Evangelization, also known as 'Seoul 2024.' This exciting, 'once-in-a generation' gathering coincides with the celebration of 50 years since Lausanne's inception.
